

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Over the past ten years, The Writing Revolution has been at the forefront of transforming writing instruction, reaching thousands of educators and students across the United States and internationally. Our journey has been marked by significant milestones, from our early groundwork to the wide-reaching impact we have achieved today.

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Our Approach & **Historical Overview**

The Writing Revolution (TWR) supports educators and school leaders in implementing the Hochman Method, a set of evidence-based and proven strategies for teaching expository writing. This methodology is rooted in explicit, carefully sequenced instruction, building from sentences to compositions. The Hochman Method is not a separate writing curriculum; rather, it is an approach designed to be embedded in the content being taught in any subject area and at any grade level.

Key Milestones

As The Writing Revolution celebrates its 10th anniversary, each milestone reflects how TWR's drive to meet its mission-empowering educators to transform writing instruction-has led to continued innovation. From launching its first courses to publishing The Writing Revolution 2.0, every step has strengthened our ability to reach more educators and students. These milestones attest to past success and pave the way for future advancements.



Pre-2014

After decades of developing and implementing the Hochman Method, the award-winning feature article "The Writing Revolution" is published in The Atlantic about the role of the Hochman Method in the turnaround of New Dorp High School, NYC.

2014

The Writing Revolution is incorporated and receives its 501(c)(3)status as a nonprofit organization. TWR hires its first faculty members, Toni-Ann Vroom and Dina Zoleo, and begins partnering with Washington, D.C. and New York City schools.

2017

Dr. Judith Hochman and Natalie Wexler publish The Writing Revolution: A Guide for Advancing Thinking Through Writing, which goes on to sell over 300,000 copies.

2018-2020

The Writing Revolution expands its training to educators in several states including Louisiana, where a high-impact partnership was established with Monroe City Schools.

2020

Drs. Dina Zoleo and Toni-Ann Vroom become The Writing Revolution's Co-CEOs and spearhead the launch of online training, enabling TWR to train educators all over the world.

2022


The Louisiana Department of Education launched its revised ELA Guidebooks (grades 3-5) curriculum, embedded with TWR's Hochman Method.

Thriving in the Present

TWR's programs are making a lasting impact on education by equipping educators with the tools and training to enhance student writing and thinking skills. Our efforts include comprehensive teacher and leadership training, a growing repository of digital resources, and school and district partnerships.

Ongoing Programs & Services

Courses & Workshops

TWR offers a range of courses and workshops designed to prepare educators for sustainable implementation of the Hochman Method. These sessions introduce the principles and strategies of the method, with a focus on best practices for school or district-wide adoption. Educators can participate in introductory courses tailored to grades 3-12, K-2, and STEM subjects. Leadership Workshops equip school and district leaders with best practices to implement TWR effectively, while Classroom Planning and Implementation sessions allow educators to deepen their understanding of the Hochman Method and enhance their TWR planning and delivery.



Online Resource Library

TWR's Resource Library provides a wide variety of resources to support educators in implementing the Hochman Method, including templates for writing activities; examples of student-facing activities across subjects and grades; and classroom videos of TWR classroom instruction and assessment tools. With the addition of resources in Spanish, the library expands its accessibility, allowing even more educators to implement the Hochman Method strategies effectively.



During the 2022-2023 school year, TWR partnered with renowned research organization Mathematica to conduct a study on the impact of its training in the Hochman Method on teacher practice and confidence in teaching writing. The study, which included four school districts in Louisiana, revealed the following findings among treatment teachers compared to their peers in control schools:

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92%

probability that TWR training positively impacted the use of evidence-based writing strategies

97%

probability that TWR training increased teacher confidence in teaching writing by the end of the school year

Transforming Writing In Partner Schools & Districts

At TWR, we believe that every student deserves the writing skills essential for success in school and beyond. Our partnerships with schools and districts demonstrate how, through explicit writing instruction, students can not only develop these critical skills but also achieve greater academic success. Together, we are proving that effective writing instruction can drive meaningful change in classrooms.

Greenburgh Central School District Greenburgh, NY

The Writing Revolution began its partnership with Greenburgh Central School District in 2018, and over the years, it has grown to be implemented across all grade levels and subject areas. This sustained collaboration has empowered educators to integrate the Hochman Method into their teaching, enhancing student writing and literacy across the district. Greenburgh students have also achieved significant recognition, successfully placing every year in TWR's national Black History Month Writing Contest. The district's commitment to fostering strong writing skills exemplifies the impact of this dynamic partnership.



P.S. 21 Margaret Emery-Elm Park Staten Island, NY

P.S. 21 Margaret Emery-Elm Park, nestled in Staten Island's North Shore community, has been a dedicated partner of TWR since 2020. The school's commitment to embedding TWR strategies throughout all grades and subjects has resulted in meaningful growth in student achievement

In 2024, the school continued its upward trajectory, with nearly 60% of students meeting or exceeding proficiency standards on the state ELA assessment—over 10 percentage points higher than the city average. Notably, the third-grade class stood out with a 77% proficiency rate, further highlighting the impact of focused writing instruction.



Newark School District Newark, NJ

In the 2022-23 school year, TWR entered into a partnership with Newark Public Schools (NPS), the largest public school district in New Jersey, serving approximately 50,000 students across more than 60 schools spread over four wards. During the first year of this partnership, TWR trained over 1,500 ELA educators and worked with several schools, aiming to establish them as models of writing instruction for other schools in the district.

Last year, NPS launched its first Revolutionary Team, consisting of K-8 ELA educators dedicated to embedding the Hochman Method into the district's ELA curriculum.

During the summer, the Revolutionary Team, led by TWR's Senior Manager of Revolutionary Projects, Kiersten Peltier, and supported by TWR staff, continued to refine the K-8 ELA units. We are excited to continue working with NPS educators on transforming writing instruction across the district.



Kevin Cataldo, one of the Revolutionary Team members, reflected on the impact of this work:

"The Revolutionary work has helped me facilitate the writing instruction I do in my classroom. It also allows me to teach content and writing at the same time. When I first started my career in teaching, I taught content and writing separately, and now I have merged the two and have seen an impact in my classroom."

Monroe City Schools

Monroe, LA

Monroe City Schools (MCS) is a predominantly African-American district with one of the highest poverty rates in Louisiana. Since 2018, TWR has partnered with MCS, which now serves as a model for other districts across the state.



Starting the Revolution

MCS began its writing revolution after attending the 2017 Louisiana Teacher Leader Summit. Inspired by TWR, teachers and district leaders recognized it as the key to improving student writing. With the support of then-Director of Curriculum and Instruction, Serena White, MCS launched its journey by training ELA teachers in grades 3-12. This districtwide focus on writing instruction laid the foundation for a consistent, cohesive strategy that reached every classroom.



Advancing the Revolution

As the revolution gained momentum, training expanded to include K-2, math, and science teachers, fostering a unified language of writing instruction across grades and subjects. To support their district-wide implementation efforts, TWR provided school site visits, assessment of student writing, and coaching. In 2019, MCS established the Revolutionary Team, a group of educators dedicated to embedding TWR strategies into the ELA curriculum. This focus on writing caught the attention of the Louisiana Department of Education, leading to a partnership that incorporated TWR strategies into the state's ELA Guidebooks for grades 3-5, released statewide in 2022. By 2023, MCS deepened its commitment by launching a K-2 Revolutionary Team, ensuring that even the youngest students benefit from the transformative power of TWR.



During the Louisiana Teacher Leader Summit, Revolutionary educators from Monroe City Schools (MCS) shared their district's story of successfully implementing TWR and its positive impact on student outcomes.

Owning the Revolution

Monroe City Schools has not only embraced TWR but has fully taken ownership of its success, as demonstrated by the remarkable achievements in the 2022-2023 LEAP assessments. At Sallie Humble Elementary, students exceeded state averages in writing proficiency. Notably, Black and economically disadvantaged students made significant gains, highlighting the power of explicit writing instruction in closing achievement gaps.

In May 2024, MCS's Revolutionary Team presented their journey at the Louisiana Teacher Leader Summit, showcasing the district's selfgovernance in writing instruction. Their presentation demonstrated how TWR strategies are now embedded into the district's DNA, solidifying MCS's commitment to sustainable, high-quality writing instruction.

MCS stands as a lighthouse for other districts looking to lead their own writing revolutions.



Reflecting on Our Journey; Thriving in the Present; Writing the Next Chapter

Judith Hochman, Ed.D., Founder of The Writing Revolution

When I reflect on the journey that led to the creation of The Writing Revolution, I'm often struck by how unexpected it all was. In the 80s, I was a mother of young children, teaching 7th grade, going to graduate school and I needed a short break. Attending a conference about literacy in Hoboken, New Jersey seemed like a good decision at the time, and it turned out to be a pivotal moment in my life. One of the presentations focused on teaching strategies for a large influx of Spanish-speaking students, with an emphasis on writing. That's when it hit me: writing, as it was being taught, wasn't working.

That realization was the spark for what would eventually become TWR. I began to understand that writing is, in many ways, like learning a second language. It has its own structure and its own rules that are different from speaking. Unless students-and teachers-grasp that, students wouldn't be able to express themselves in written language successfully. Writing is about thinking deeply and clearly. I became convinced that writing needed to be integrated into every subject-not taught as an isolated skill, but as a powerful tool for learning. Writing is thinking. When students write, they deepen their connection to the content they're learning. This belief became the cornerstone of my work.

Writing is often considered the most difficult skill to learn and to teach. As I refined the method, I realized that this approach could be taught in manageable segments and would be beneficial for all students, in all grades and across the curriculum.

While working with underserved schools, I observed students, who had struggled for years, learn to express themselves clearly and confidently in ways they hadn't thought possible. Teachers were equally inspired, recognizing how writing could be seamlessly integrated into their daily instruction. They weren't just teaching students to write-they were enabling them to build their knowledge base more effectively.

The real turning point for TWR came in October of 2012, when The Atlantic published an article about our work at New Dorp High School in Staten Island, New York City. Titled "The Writing Revolution," the article highlighted the profound impact our method had on the school and its students, and it was





Since then, the impact has been profound and far-reaching. TWR is transforming writing instruction across the United States and beyond. It's empowering teachers and students alike. One of the most rewarding outcomes has been witnessing students, particularly those from historically underserved and marginalized communities, gain the confidence and skills they need to succeed-and not just in writing. They're learning to think critically, ask important questions, and articulate their ideas with clarity and coherence.

I'm incredibly proud of the impact we've had so far, but I know this is just the beginning. Together, The Writing Revolution is changing lives-one sentence at a time.


How the Abrahamson Scholarship Fuels Change


Deepening Partnerships & Expanding Impact


Innovating with AI-Driven Tools

We are developing additional course offerings and upgrading our Resource Library to provide educators with access to the tools they need to implement the Hochman Method effectively.





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
